

THE KARL STIRNER ARTS TRAIL (KSAT), named for internationally-known Easton sculptor Karl Stirner, is a scenic 2.4 mile path that runs along the Bushkill Creek and through Downtown Easton; it connects Easton's Downtown, West Ward, and College Hill areas. The Trail was completed in 2011 through a partnership with the City of Easton and Lafayette College.

The trail along the creek is currently home to a growing and rotating collection of contemporary art pieces which have been installed as a result of donations and fundraisers, or are on loan from artists and collectors. 
The Friends of the Karl Stirner Arts Trail is a grass-roots

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
